7. Discussion of Draft Climate Smart Ports Act and input to CA-44 Congresswoman Nanette Diaz Barragan.

Francisco Carrillo, District Director and Gary Hardie, Jr representative for Congresswoman Nanette Barragan presented a draft bill related to ZE equipment at Ports nationwide. To direct the administrator of the EPA to establish a program to provide grants to eligible entities that provide ports with zero emissions equipment or technology, and for other purposes.

8. Discussion of informational forum regarding Rancho LPG.

**Ron Conrow - Plains LPG** provided a series of documents related to the transport of butane and propane by railcar to and from Rancho LPG.

Stakeholders often have questions regarding activities at the facility. A suggestion - that proactive information distribution prevents misinformation from being distributed and facilitates better communication. A proposal to create a communication methodology, one that ensures the community is notified of improvements, maintenance, any potentially noticeable activities in and around the facility.
